Background

Growth can no longer be taken as granted. Today shrinkage is widespread in urban Europe. Despite this fact it is often disregarded as a dominant long term development trend.

While urban decline is on the increase it seems opportune to review the paradigm behind the established views of urban growth and change. To deal with the results of demographic, economic and physical contraction processes and to plan for the future of considerably smaller but nevertheless livable cities is one of the most challenging tasks for urban Europe in the near future.

The Franco-German workshop series addresses the issue urbanization and strategic planning under the condition of urban shrinkage. The aim of this workshop is to discuss issues of shrinking cities from three different angles: urban strategies, adaptation of infrastructure, and shrinkage in suburbia.
